Is There a Difference between Mercy and Grace?

Exodus 34:6 The LORD passed before him and proclaimed, "The LORD, the LORD, a God merciful and gracious, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love and faithfulness,

Ephesians 2:4 - 9

4 But God, being rich in <u>mercy</u>, because of the great love with which he loved us,

5 even when we were dead in our trespasses, made us alive together with Christ—by *grace* you have been saved—

6 and raised us up with him and seated us with him in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus,

7 so that in the coming ages he might show the immeasurable riches of his *grace* in kindness toward us in Christ Jesus.

8 For by *grace* you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God,

9 not a result of works, so that no one may boast.

Hebrews 4:16 Let us then with confidence draw near to the throne of <u>grace</u>, that we may receive <u>mercy</u> and find <u>grace</u> to help in time of need.

Mercy - we don't get what we deserve.

Grace - we get what we don't deserve.

Man's Presumptions of Deservedness Vs. God's Mercy and Grace

- The Metaphysical Optimist:
 - We are living in a universe of *inherent justice* (as I judge it myself to be)
 - Good things happen to good people
 - Bad things happen to bad people
 - o I'm totally a "good person" (as I judge myself to be)
- The Metaphysical Pessimist:
 - We are living in a universe <u>devoid of justice</u> (as I judge it myself to be)
 - The notions of good and bad don't really exist
 - Things happen to people without meaning
 - But still, I'm totally a "good person" (as I judge myself to be)
- The Christian:
 - We are living in a universe ruled over by a <u>God of justice</u> (He is the judge, not me)
 - Mercy keeps us from getting what we deserve
 - Grace provides for us what we don't deserve
 - o I am not a "good person" (but justice was satisfied for me at Calvary)

Why Do Humans Presume Themselves to Be Their Own Judges?

Genesis 3:1 - 6

4 But the serpent said to the woman, "You will not surely die.

5 For God knows that when you eat of it your eyes will be opened, and <u>you will be like God, knowing good and evil.</u>"

 Sin within us deceives us into presuming that we can <u>know</u> and judge good and evil on our own, without God. After all, are we just <u>like</u> him?



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Who is a "Good Person?" - What Do We All Actually Deserve?

Romans 3:10 - 18, 23

- 10 as it is written: "None is righteous, no, not one;
- 11 no one understands; no one seeks for God.
- **12** All have turned aside; together they have become worthless; no one does good, not even one."
- **13** "Their throat is an open grave; they use their tongues to deceive." "The venom of asps is under their lips."
- 14 "Their mouth is full of curses and bitterness."
- **15** "Their feet are swift to shed blood;
- 16 in their paths are ruin and misery,
- 17 and the way of peace they have not known."
- 18 "There is no fear of God before their eyes."
- 23 for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God
- Ours is a gospel of *mercy* and *grace*
 - o Mercy Christ took for us what we earned; the penalty we all deserved.
 - o Grace Christ offers to us what he earned; the reward only he deserved.

An Example of Despising God's Grace

- The Parable of the Laborers in the Vineyard Matthew 20:1 16
- Verse 1 early in the morning (proi): at dawn, at about 6:00 AM
- **Verse 2** <u>denarius</u>: a fair wage for a day's worth of work
- Verse 3 The third hour was about 9:00 AM
- Verse 5 The sixth hour was about 12 noon. The ninth hour was about 3:00 PM.
- Verse 6 The eleventh hour was about 5:00 PM. There is one working hour left in the day.
- Question #1 Friend, I am doing you no wrong. Did you not agree with me for a denarius?
- **Question #2** Am I not allowed to do what I choose with what belongs to me?
- **Question #3** Or do you begrudge my generosity?

An Example of Despising God's Mercy

Jonah 2:7 - 9

- **7** When my life was fainting away, I remembered the LORD, and my prayer came to you, into your holy temple.
- 8 Those who pay regard to vain idols forsake their hope of steadfast love.
- **9** But I with the voice of thanksgiving will sacrifice to you; what I have vowed I will pay. Salvation belongs to the LORD!"

<u>Steadfast love(hesed)</u>: steadfast love, loving-kindness, compassion, mercy

Jonah 4:2 And he prayed to the LORD and said, "O LORD, is not this what I said when I was yet in my country? That is why I made haste to flee to Tarshish; for I knew that you are a gracious God and merciful, slow to anger and abounding in <u>steadfast love(hesed)</u>, and relenting from disaster.
